

Expectations of Coaching Staff

- 1. Ensure players safety.
- 2. Model the kind of behavior you want your athletes to take on.
- 3. Accept the responsibility of being a role model for their families, the school, and the community.
- 4. Place academic success and football success on the same level.
- 5. Teach kids to love the game, make it fun.
- 6. Instill in the kids the mindset of COMMUNITY; help them to understand how important it is that they play hard for the community; help them understand that it's important to give back.
- 7. Prepare the kids for fatherhood and the professional world by teaching them, responsibility, courage, toughness, discipline, dedication and excellence.
- 8. Assist in planning practice and designing drills.
- 9. Strongest coaches will be paired up with weaker or less experienced coaches in order to mentor them and assist their progress.
- 10. Game management; Offensive Coordinator-Defensive Coordinator-Special Teams Coordinator.
- 11. Coordinators will be expected to assist with the development of all sub-varsity programs including youth feeder programs in the community from Junior Varsity to 3rd grade Pop-Warner.
- 12. All staff will be expected to attend off-season Weight Lifting and Skill Development events.
