School Representation Eligibility Checklist
For a Student Who Does Not Attend the School He or She Wishes to Represent

INTRODUCTION: Under certain restricted circumstances, OSAA rules allow students who are not attending a member school to represent that school in competition. The eligibility rules governing that participation vary somewhat depending upon the school the student is attending.

This list of questions is intended to serve as a checklist of questions to assist administrators in determining whether a student who does not attend a school is eligible to represent that school in competition.

If the answer to any of these questions is “NO”, the student may be ineligible, and you should not allow the student to represent the school in competition until eligibility has been thoroughly investigated and confirmed.

MEMBER PRIVATE SCHOOL. Questions public school personnel should ask of a member private school student who wishes to represent his or her resident public school in competition.

1. Is the joint residence of you and your parents located within the attendance boundaries of our high school?
2. Is the private school you are attending a member of the OSAA?
3. Is the activity in which you wish to participate unavailable at the private school you are attending?
4. Have both the principal at your private school and the principal at our high school agreed to allow you to represent our school in competition?

ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL. Questions public school personnel should ask of an alternative school student who wishes to represent his or her resident public school in competition.

1. Is the joint residence of you and your parents located within the attendance boundaries of our high school?
2. ***Is the alternative school you are attending either a public alternative school run by a public school district or a private alternative school that is registered with the State Department of Education?***
3. ***Is the activity in which you wish to participate unavailable at the alternative school you are attending?***
4. ***Have both the principal of the alternative school you are attending and the principal at our high school agreed to allow you to represent our school in competition.***

NON-OSAA MEMBER CHARTER SCHOOL. Questions public school personnel should ask of a student who attends a non-OSAA member charter school and who wishes to represent his or her resident public school in competition.

1. Is the joint residence of you and your parents located within the attendance boundaries of our high school?
2. Have you confirmed that the charter school you are attending is NOT a member of the OSAA? (Note: If the charter school the student is attending is a member of the OSAA, the student may represent that charter school only; the student is not eligible to represent his or her resident public school.)
3. Have both the principal at your charter school principal and the principal at our high school agreed to allow you to represent our school in competition?

ASSOCIATE MEMBER PRIVATE SCHOOL. Questions public school personnel should ask of a student attending an associate member private school and who wishes to represent his or her resident public school in competition.

1. Is the joint residence of you and your parents located within the attendance boundaries of our high school?
2. Is the private school you are attending an Associate Member of the OSAA?
3. Have both the principal at your private school and the principal at our high school agreed to allow you to represent our school?

HOME SCHOOLED. Questions school personnel should ask of a home schooled student who wishes to represent his or her resident public school in competition or wishes to represent a private school located within the resident public school attendance boundaries.

1. Is the joint residence of you and your parents located within the attendance boundaries of our public high school, or within the attendance boundaries of the public high school in whose attendance boundaries our private high school is located?
2. Were you registered as a home schooled student with our local educational service district (ESD) prior to the first day of the school year?
3. If you transferred from a public or private school to a home school setting, were you academically eligible at the time of the transfer?
4. Did you achieve at least the minimum test score (23rd percentile) on one of the required achievement tests* accepted by the Oregon Department of Education prior to August 15?
